MESSAGES		
Mr Humphreys	Whole School	 Dear Parents/Carers Further to the update last week (below) on the amount of cover we are currently experiencing in the school, we expect this to improve from the beginning of Term 5. We are doing all we can to protect the delivery of the curriculum through the resources provided within our cover hub model and recognise this is only ever a short term model. We have experienced an unfortunate amount of staff absence since February which is impacting on the delivery of our curriculum for some classes. Where individual classes are affected by longer term absence, we are rotating classes with a subject specialist to ensure that lessons are delivered by subject specialists, with time taken to check and clarify work set within the Cover Hub. For example, at least two out of five GCSE lessons a fortnight. Where possible, we have secured subject specialists from within Cathedral Schools Trust to deliver lessons to further minimise the impact on students. Our Cover Hub has provided a productive study environment for students to complete work set in each subject, test and recall prior knowledge along with practicing mathematics on Sparx. Students have responded well to this on the whole and we are conscious of how this feels for students when, on occasions, have spent up to three lessons in a single day in the coverhub. We have reviewed and modified how work is set, along with a focus on the monitoring and completion of the work set by both teachers and students to minimise disruption and coverage of the planned curriculum. We recognise this is not ideal and looking forward to returning to a full complement of staff as soon as possible. Thank you for your ongoing support and understanding.

Finance	Whole School	Parentpay One-Click Payments (Bank Transfer) We are currently experiencing a lot of failed payments. Parentpay is encouraging parents/carers to use this payment method rather than card payment. As a school we do not like this as potentially a transaction can fail several days later causing lunch accounts to go overdrawn. The direct debits take 3 working days to set up before a payment should be attempted. The transaction can then take another 4 days to show on your bank statement. We would recommend continuing with card payment as these transactions are pre-authorised. This can be done by skipping the first page asking you to set up a One Click payment then selecting the 'Add To Basket' button and then 'Other Payment Method' button.


